



SOME POINTERS ON HOW TO FILL IN THE ONLINE PROPOSAL

PROGRAMME OF INVITATIONS

Alongside the substantial residential support offered by CIRM for the majority of participants in the planned events (40 places for the Conference and 40 places for the Research School, board and lodging paid), CIRM also wishes to support invitations. We hope that this special support of €20,000/semester can be maintained in the coming years, but candidates need to be aware that it is subject to funds being made available in each yearly budget, and that support may have to decrease. CIRM has pledged to have, in any case, at least €10,000 available for each semester and will always try to look for additional funds.

This special support is intended for the invitation of international researchers (professors, researchers, post-doctoral researchers, doctoral students etc.) who would really add to or benefit from the proposed programme of activities during that semester.

The recipients, whose venue should be directly linked to the scientific programme of activities, are chosen by the Jean-Morlet Chair holder / Local project leader. The guests are entitled to a 'Full' invitation for the whole duration of their visit (this may include accommodation, meals and/or travel costs between home and Marseille). The invitations, which can be of varied length, may be repeated. The decision to grant travel and/or accommodation belongs to the beneficiaries of the Chair.

Accommodation can be reserved onsite at CIRM (early booking is essential) or can be privately arranged outside at a hotel or other accommodation that can deliver an invoice. €90 per day maximum can be refunded if guests book accommodation outside CIRM. NB: note that receipts will have to be produced for any refund.

A list of possible recipients of this programme should be communicated to CIRM's Events Budget Officer and JM Coordinator early on, and names should be provided on the online proposal.

Please note that this support is partly granted by an external body to CIRM, within very precise limits and with the aim to favour CIRM as a dedicated residential place for research in mathematics in the Region. Funds may only therefore be used to attract participants over to CIRM, but not for beneficiaries to travel away or pay for external conference fees, accommodation etc.
